

Charlie Precourt joined Northrop Grumman in 2005 and retired in 2021 as the Vice President and General Manager for the company's Propulsion Systems Division, which provides rocket propulsion systems and technologies to DoD, NASA, and commercial users. He led a workforce of 3,000 employees in engineering, manufacturing operations and program management with a portfolio including NASA's Space Launch System and Orion Launch Abort System, the US Navy Trident D5 and USAF Ground Based Strategic Deterrent and Minuteman Missile systems, as well as Satellite Launcher boost propulsion for United Launch Alliance's Delta, Atlas and Vulcan launch vehicles. Precourt joined Northrop Grumman following a distinguished 15-year career with the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) where he was as an Astronaut and a program manager in the Senior Executive Service. He also served twenty-three years in the US Air Force, retiring as a Colonel.

Precourt entered USAF active duty upon commissioning from the US Air Force Academy in 1977. He completed US Air Force Pilot Training in 1978 and served as an instructor pilot at Reese Air Force Base in Texas. From 1981 to 1984 he was an F-15 pilot and flight commander at Bitburg Air Base in Germany. He then attended the USAF Test Pilot School at Edwards AFB and served as a test pilot on the F-15E developmental test program and later as an instructor at the USAF Test Pilot School.

At NASA Precourt was qualified as an astronaut in 1991, and is a veteran of four Space Shuttle missions. He completed his first mission in 1993 on Columbia and then was the pilot of Atlantis for the first Shuttle docking with the Mir Space Station in 1995. He later commanded two additional docking missions to the Mir Space Station on Atlantis and Discovery. Precourt was also Director of

Operations for NASA at the Gagarin Cosmonaut Training Center in Star City, Russia. From 1998 through 2002, Precourt was Chief of the Astronaut Corps, responsible for the selection, training and mission certification of all Space Shuttle and International Space Station crews. Charlie was then appointed Deputy Program Manager for the International Space Station, responsible for the day-to-day management of ISS operations, on orbit assembly and the interfaces with NASA contractors and the ISS International Partners. Prior to leaving NASA in 2005, Precourt was the Program Manager for the Crew Exploration Vehicle, known today as Orion, under NASA's Space Exploration initiative.

Precourt serves as the vice chairman of the board of directors of the Experimental Aircraft Association and is a member of the board of directors of the National Business Aviation Association. He has accumulated over 11,000 hours of flight experience in 90 different aircraft types. Among the aircraft he has flown are the F-15, F-4, F-16, A-7, the WWII Spitfire, P-51 Mustang, the Mig-21, L-39, the U-2, several versions of the Cessna Citation, the C-141 and KC-135, the Gulfstream GII, numerous light aircraft and gliders. He built an experimental VariEze and today flies a Citation CJ1+. He holds commercial, instrument and CFI ratings. A native of Hudson, Massachusetts, Charlie received a Bachelor of Science degree in aeronautical engineering from the United States Air Force Academy in 1977. While at the United States Air Force Academy, Precourt also attended the French Air Force Academy in 1976 as part of an exchange program. He earned a Master of Science degree in engineering management from Golden Gate University in 1988, and a Master of Arts degree in national security affairs and strategic studies from the United States Naval War College in 1990, and completed executive coursework in business administration at Wharton in 2012 and 2013.

As president and chief executive officer, Ron Draper is the leader of Textron Aviation, encompassing the Cessna and Beechcraft brands.

Draper joined Textron in 1999 and has held various leadership roles in Textron business units through the years, including 13 years at Textron Aviation. His previous roles at Textron Aviation include senior vice president of Integrated Supply Chain (ISC); director of Production Control and Logistics; and director of Supply Chain Management. Draper also served as vice president of Integrated Supply Chain and director of Strategic Sourcing for Textron Specialized Vehicles; and director of Procurement for the V-22 Osprey program at Bell Helicopter.

While serving as senior vice president of Integrated Supply Chain at Textron Aviation, Draper was responsible for overseeing the manufacturing operations for all Beechcraft and Cessna commercial products including the Beechcraft King Air and Cessna Citation lines. Seven different products – the Cessna Citation Latitude, Citation X+, Citation Sovereign+, Citation CJ3+, Citation M2, Cessna TTx and Cessna

Grand Caravan EX – all achieved entry into service under his leadership in ISC.

Prior to joining Textron, Draper served as a Captain in the United States Army as a UH-60 Blackhawk helicopter pilot and company commander. His overseas assignments included tours in Bosnia, South Korea and Germany. Draper is also a fixed wing multi-engine commercial rated pilot and enjoys flying a broad range of Textron Aviation aircraft. Most recently, Draper received second in command (SIC) qualification in the 525 series of Citation jets.

Draper received a bachelor's degree in Engineering Management from the United States Military Academy in 1990, and earned an MBA from Wichita State University in 2001.

An active member of the community, Draper serves on the boards of the Greater Wichita Partnership, General Aviation Manufacturers Association and the National Association of Manufacturers. He is a frequent supporter of many community charitable causes including the company's own employee-led Uplift organization that assist employees and communities where Textron Aviation operates facilities.

Peter Basile is a Senior Air Safety Investigator at Textron Aviation. He is a graduate of the University of Central Missouri where he earned his Master of Science degree in Aviation Safety. He began his career with Cessna in 2001 as a Manufacturing Engineer supporting the Citation Bravo (550) and Citation Encore (560) production lines. He worked on the Citation Mustang (510) from the prototype phase through production unit number 3.

In 2005, he began investigating Cessna aircraft accidents. In 2014, the Textron Aviation Air Safety Investigations department began investigating all Cessna, Hawker, and Beechcraft accidents. He has participated as an NTSB party member on over 180 investigations ranging from Cessna 140's and Beechcraft Musketeers to current

production Beechcraft King Air's and Citation business jets.

Peter served on the General Aviation Joint Steering Committee for System Component Failures of Power Plants to develop safety enhancements and intervention strategies for accident prevention. He instructs at the DOT Transportation Safety Institute in Oklahoma City, OK and at the NTSB academy in Ashburn, VA. He has presented safety information for the Citation Jet Pilot Association, The Cessna Twin Flyer organization, the General Aviation Air Safety Investigators annual workshop, and at FAA sponsored Airframe and Powerplant mechanic Inspection Authorization conferences. He holds a private pilot certificate with an instrument rating, and he is an Airframe and Powerplant mechanic with Inspection Authorization.

Scholl leverages the work across Textron's aerospace and defense businesses in developing new opportunities to take advantage of fixed wing and rotorcraft expertise in emerging aerospace technologies and markets.

He is responsible for building external partnerships and creating a path for the further development and utilization of aircraft electrification and connected mobility technologies in the global market.

Scholl was previously senior vice president of Textron's eAviation initiative prior to it becoming a Textron business segment. Prior to his role with eAviation, he was Textron Aviation's senior vice president – Sales, leading the global Commercial Aircraft Sales, Pre-Owned Sales and Flight Operations. He was responsible for global sales initiatives to ensure a strong and direct

industry presence to meet customers' needs for Cessna and Beechcraft jets, turboprops and pistons. Rob also served on the Board of Directors of Flight Safety Textron Aviation Training.

Scholl's prior roles within the company included vice president of Customer Service Parts & Programs, vice president of Marketing, and regional vice president of Sales.

He began his career with Textron in 2007 as a member of Textron's Leadership Development Program where he was a manager of Customer Leadership in Sales & Marketing. In 2008, Scholl was promoted to director of Corporate Strategy at Textron Inc. Later in 2010, he moved to CWC, a division of Kautex, as director of Business Development.



WEDNESDAY FIRST YEAR JET OWNERSHIP FORUM

KEITH URBAN

Keith Urban has spent the better part of his life harnessing a deep-seated passion for music. This, when combined with his authenticity, talent and driving musical inquisitiveness, helps to understand why he is one of the most successful and well-respected artists in the world. He's won four GRAMMY® Awards, thirteen CMAs, fifteen ACMs, three AMAs, two People's Choice Awards and celebrated nine consecutive gold, platinum or multi-platinum albums.

This year begins a new musical chapter for Urban. While his current single "Wild Hearts," continues its climb on the charts, there'll be new music coming, some as early as the Spring. And for those who've ever seen Urban live, they know that's when he's at his best – and in 2022 that's exactly what they're going to get.

Finally, the stage that's stood vacant for nearly four years will be occupied by one of the music world's best live performers. Urban's "The Speed of Now World Tour 2022," promises to be his biggest. It is currently scheduled to play to fans in four countries, including the U.S., U.K., Australia and Canada, on three continents. His concerts have become legendary - as unpredictable as they are explosive. An experience of emotion, musical texture, energy and showmanship.

So, while planning for the tour is underway, there are the songs. "Wild Hearts" is an autobiographical, fist-pumping, arena-ready Urban track that is as authentic as it is infectious – quintessential Urban. It comes on the heels of "One Too Many" (his duet with P!nk), the last from The Speed of Now Part 1, which marked his fourth in an historic streak of simultaneous #1 album debuts in the United States, Canada and Australia..

"Speed" produced the top 5 songs "God Whispered Your Name," and "We Were," as well as "One Too Many" that not only gave Urban his 43rd Top 10 single in the U.S. and his 27th #1 in Canada. The song also reached #1 on the Australian Artist singles chart, spent 44 weeks in the Top 50 on the UK Airplay Chart and garnered over 100 million Spotify streams in just 10 months.

Since the release of "Speed," while COVID turned the touring world on its head, 2020 saw Urban do what he does best – make music. He was featured on two songs from Taylor Swift's album Fearless (Taylor's Version) including "That's When" and "We Were Happy," was a part of the performance of the John Lennon's "Imagine," for the opening ceremonies of the Olympics, as well as co- host for the 56th Annual Academy of Country Music Awards. He also collaborated with Yamaha for the release of the URBAN Guitar and lessons app.

Urban's musical virtuosity and fluidity has made him the musician's musician. He's collaborated with a diverse group of artists that include, among others; Billy Gibbons, Buddy Guy, Carrie Underwood, Chris Stapleton, Eric Church, John Mayer, Julia Michaels, Justin Timberlake, Dzeko, Miranda Lambert, Nile Rodgers, Post Malone, Taylor Swift, The Rolling Stones and Vince Gill.

He's long supported numerous charities. His "All For The Hall" benefit concerts for the Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum® have raised over \$4.2 million. He is the first Ambassador of the CMA Foundation, an advisory board member at the St. Jude's Children's Hospital and is a longtime supporter of The Mr. Holland's Opus Fund and The Grammy Foundation.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What should I expect if attending the annual meeting for the first time?

The CJP annual Convention is THE premier aircraft owner meeting in the world. You will be impressed with the quality of the seminars, social events and organization of the total event. Every little detail is well planned in advance and those that attend the meeting almost always return. Both the pilots and companions make many new friendships at the conventions.

What does the registration fee cover?

The registration fee covers all food from Wednesday night through Saturday at 1:30pm. It also includes transportation during the official arrival and departure times, gifts, seminars, etc. You should not have any extra expenses except your room and shopping.

Do I have to be a CJP Member to attend?

Do I have to pay for my spouse/companion or guests?

This year the CJP board of directors has kept the lowered price for an owner's spouse/companion. This registration rate is limited to one Companion/Spouse per paid owner registrant and is limited to a companion or spouse that resides in the same household as the primary registrant. Additional guests can be registered at the regular rate. The majority of the money spent on the CJP Annual Meeting is for food, beverages, transportation, etc., therefore everyone must pay a registration fee.

Do I have to pay the full registration fee if I can only attend a day or two?

Yes. There are multiple costs that are incurred whether someone attends for one day or the entire Convention. As such, we have just one registration fee

What if I have to cancel after registering?

Registrations are 100% refundable if you cancel before September 27th, 2022. After September 27th, 2022 there will be no refunds.

Do I need to rent a car for the convention?

Normally, no. Transportation will be provided compliments of CJP from Cutter Aviation to the JW Marriott Austin & on Tuesday, October, 25th from

11:00am to 7:00pm and Wednesday, October 26th from 9:00am to 7:00pm. If you arrive at any other times, you will need to make your own transportation arrangements.
